In Mark's gospel, Christmas begins with a John the Baptist preparing the way of the Lord, and preaching people into being ready for the coming of the Christ.

In John's gospel, Christmas begins with the word, who was with God from the beginning, and who is God, becoming flesh and dwelling among us.

In these, and many ways more, Christmas begins with the preparing and waiting for a promised child who brings the unexpected grace of angels singing peace on earth and shepherds going to see a child laying in manger.

I wonder when Christmas might begin for you this year.

Perhaps it will begin as you prepare your heart for the gift only Christ can give by making time to refresh yourself with the promises of God, or maybe in the light of a candle flickering in the night, or with the beauty of a song that promises of a new and glorious morn. However Christmas begins for you this year, I pray that it will grace you with a peace brought by a child whose love makes us and all things new.

THE WELL, IMMANUEL'S OUTREACH MINISTRY

The Well, an outreach mission of IUMC, continues to serve our community by offering a "kids' place" every Tuesday after school for 20-30 children, providing Grab 'n Go meals, averaging 125, every Wednesday and operating a client choice food pantry for 30+ registered families the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month.


None of this would be possible without the dedication and support of its volunteers, monetary donations from other churches, organizations, individuals, Immanuel's members and God's direction.

Costs for food for the weekly meals and food pantry items have been increasing with limited free or low cost food supplies available from the York County Food Bank. The Well has been fortunate in receiving donations from the local Chamber of Ravens Nest (\$1,700), a donation from Smiles for Life from Dr. Steven Haywood, dentist in Shrewsbury (\$1,054) and Immanuel's members.

Twelve families registered at the food pantry will be receiving free Thanksgiving meal food boxes with donations of items from Zion, Trinity and New Hope churches. Ten (10) turkeys (10-16lbs each) are needed for the boxes which will be picked up Monday, November 24 at The Well from 4:00pm-6:00pm. If you can donate a turkey, please contact Judy. Monetary donations to purchase food items for the boxes can also be given to the church or Judy.

The Well is planning to offer Christmas meal food boxes to food pantry clients also. Additional information will be placed in the Sunday bulletins.

American Legion Riders will, again, collaborate with The Well and purchase gifts for the Annual Christmas Party for the children attending The Well. The party will be held Saturday, December 6 with the retelling of the Nativity, followed by lunch and a visit from Santa.

OUR MISSION STATEMENT:


